



Opportunities and challenges of Natura 2000 areas

Opportunities

Development of sustainable tourism and green jobs

Attractive environment for living, **recreation** and enjoyment of nature

Possibilities for developing **local identity** and attracting new investments

Natural protection from flooding and climate change regulation

Possibilities for research and education











Challenges

Finding **alternative solutions** regarding spatial planning

Adjusting the intensity of **forest exploitation** and utilisation

Decreasing the intensity or changing the manner of farming

Coordinating measures for flood safety and species conservation

Monitoring costs

Protecting environment for future generations

Planning concerning Natura 2000 areas



Institute of the Republic of Slovenia for Nature Conservation and Ministry of the Environment and Spatial Planning adequately planned objectives and measures





Government of the Republic of Slovenia **adopted** Natura 2000 Management Programme for the period 2015-2020



Implementing measures concerning Natura 2000 areas

- The Institute and the Ministry mostly adequately participated in planning of activities of various sectors
- The Ministry and the Government did not always enable the Institute to participate



Cooperation among sectors could be additionally improved.

Monitoring the managing of Natura 2000 areas

- The Institute has not yet established the system for implementing measures
- The Ministry does not fully provide for the foreseen monitoring of animal and plant species conservation status



Both are required for monitoring the managing of Natura 2000 areas.

An example of monitoring the implementation of some measures in agriculture

Through 100% implementation of certain Natura 2000 measures the framers could be annually granted at least additional

€4,998,726

In 2015, only 17.6% implementation.

In 2016, only 22.6% implementation.

- Why are the measures not implemented?
 - ? Implementation is voluntary
 - ? Farmers not interested enough
 - Insufficient promotion of measures



Examples of good and bad practices concerning Natura 2000 areas

The Ministry and the Government failed to include the Institute in the planning phase, which led to a Natura 2000 habitat destruction (the Iščica river)

Coordinated measures for water management prepared (Live Drava)



The Institute expressed a negative opinion as regards 5 of 12 municipal spatial plans (due tonon-compliance with the guidelines of the Institute, inadequate mitigation measures)



Improvement of species conservation status achieved (the Škocjan inlet)



OPINION OF THE COURT OF AUDIT

Management of Natura 2000 areas was partially efficient and could be additionally improved, especially in the field of monitoring.
