


The number of medical doctors increases



Is the existing public healthcare network optimal?

The Ministry of Health, without performing analyses, approved the correctness of the capitation system and medical standards and norms that would support the optimal healthcare network. No unified network failed to analyse the of public healthcare service. workload of the doctors EN SE failed to analyse organisation procedures of doctors and healthcare service Not clear in which regions and failed to schedule medical specialist fields the shortage doctors work posts of doctors is evident. as prescribed by Medical Services Act

The needs for additional doctors are not appropriately assessed



The legal arrangement does not provide for the desired outcomes

in relief of overloaded doctors and in assuring additional capacities of doctors







Awarding concessions



the system enables **awarding concessions incompatible to the realistic needs** for additional doctors



Financing the second specialisation

employing a doctor is postponed for as many years as the duration of the second specialisation



Model practices



additional burden to family medicine physicians included in the project



Refunding of specialisation costs when not employed in the public network



helps to prevent immediate employment of young doctors abroad or in private practice



Project rewarding of doctors



not equal treatment of doctors since rewarding is not based on actual workload of doctors



Employing doctors from the third countries



employments are **not necessarily linked to the actually assessed needs** for foreign doctors



the Slovenian language proficiency exam is demanding and represents an obstacle in recognition of professional qualifications



Concluding contracts for services



no control over the actual additional workload within the concluded contracts for services as well as total workload of doctors




not clear **how additional work impacts** the actual **capacities**of doctors

OPINION OF THE COURT OF AUDIT



The Ministry of Health and the Medical Chamber of Slovenia were not efficient in

- enabling the efficient entry of medical doctors to the labour market
- balancing ratio between the needed and available number of doctors.



Since they failed to assess the actual needs for doctors by individual specialisation and did not assess the reasons for their shortage, they were not able to effectively address them.
