









Judicial internship is the fastest way to state bar examination



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
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Growing needs for jurists who have passed the state bar exam, but we do not know how many are actually needed 2,000



due to long waiting lists candidates found employment elsewhere

interest in judicial internship needs to be stimulated!



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






Implementation of judicial internship is not fully satisfactory

ANSWERS TO THE SURVEY by judicial interns





flexible working time and independence at work



inappropriate workspaces and equipment



29% lower payment compared to the average

payments shall gradually increase by 41% until 2025





89% of judges wish to be mentors to judicial interns

no thorough insight into fulfilment of the obligations of judicial interns and mentors' work



lack of information on judicial internship



unequal position due to lack of instructions for writing and assessing mid-term exams



training **does not include all legal fields** subject to SBE



paying courses for the preparation to SBE



time for mentors not specified and inappropriately valued


Mentors entitled to allowance of € 260 from 2025

judicial intern fulfilled obligations



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
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OPINION OF THE COURT OF AUDIT

Judicial internship system was in the period from 2020 to 2022 arranged partially efficient.

The Court of Audit proposed several recommendations to all auditees, among them:


Ministry of Justice should:



define the number of judicial interns

considering realistic needs for jurists who passed SBE and take into account the courts' capacities

SBE



include all fields which are part of the examination for SBE in the training programme

set up a system of monitoring the number of judicial interns after they passed SBE and asses and remedy causes why former judicial interns have left the national administration of justice








Ministry of Justice and Supreme Court carried out the demanded measures already during the audit.

Supreme Court should:



carry out projections of the required number of employees who passed SBE at all courts (mid-term)

Higher Courts should:

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define instructions for mentorship to judicial interns or minimal standards
