





Recovery and Resilience Plan (RRP)


is a **medium-term action plan** agreed by Slovenia and the EU for the support of implementation of reforms and investments, aimed at RRP is an important mitigating the effects of the COVID-19 epidemic outbreak and energy development opportunity € 2.68 B crisis. 




the change of the Government and extensive reorganisation of competent authorities increased the lack of clarity regarding powers and responsibilities, and extended implementation delays




responsibility for the implementation of the RRP as a whole not defined by the Decree on the implementation of RRF



incomplete reports, lack of certain essential information necessary for efficient managing




inconsistencies among reports, **comparison** among them **not possible**




reporting **not frequent enough** and **not up to date** to ensure efficient management

Planned payment requests, amendments and realisation of the RRP




Planning and implementation of the RRP in comparison with other countries, March 2024

The Government



in April 2025, it required from URSOO to monthly report on the progress in the RRP implementation

URSOO



in 2025, it introduced
a unified reporting

it rectified technical mistakes and upgraded the information system called "Program dela" (Program of Work)

The Ministry of Finance



proposed the amendment to the Implementation of the Republic of Slovenia Budget Act to facilitate budget procedures and to remove administrative obstacles
